The death of Richard “Lloyd” Anderson of Nokomis (Last Mountain Regional Park) occurred at Regina General Hospital, Regina, Sask. on Monday, February 19, 2024.

Lloyd truly believed he was fortunate to have lived in the best of times, in the best of places and to have enjoyed the company of the best of friends.
