

Key Messages from February Board Meeting

As we settle into 2023, this is an exciting time for Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides (LFCDG). The Board of Directors recently met in person at the school in Oakville. The following is a summary of key discussions held at the Board meeting in February.

Lions Clubs

- Plans are underway to welcome the District Governors Elect for a visit and tour of the Dog Guides school and facilities in June. We are excited to welcome you for a full weekend of activities and a chance to learn more about the impact our dogs have on the lives of their handlers, as well as show you the plans for our new school
- Convention season is a busy time and we are preparing to attend as many as possible. If you need anything from LFCDG for your convention, please reach out to Danielle Rosenblum drosenblum@ dogguides.com
- As part of the normal rotation of Board Directors, we are in the process of recruiting and selecting 2 new directors; 1 from Nova Scotia, and 1 from Quebec to each serve a 3-year term starting in October 2023. Any Lion in good standing from those provinces is invited to submit their application. The board is looking to find someone who has a legal background or is familiar with the issues in the disability sector but anyone is welcome to apply. If you are interested, please connect with

Capital Campaign

- We have launched the capital campaign to raise \$25 million for our new school campus and training facilities. Our hope is to raise \$5 million from Lions Clubs across Canada. To date, 140 presentations have been made to Lions clubs across Canada and more are planned for the next few months. A total of \$1.6 million has been pledged by Lions from across the country so far and we are excited by this initial outpouring of generosity.
- We are hoping to break ground in the summer of 2023. The process of finalizing building designs and applying for approvals and permits has been a long one but the end is in sight and we are so excited to see our plans come to fruition.

Fundraising

 While the capital campaign is a major undertaking, we still need to raise money to support the day-to-day, ongoing operations. Lions play a big part in supporting the school and we are grateful for your ongoing support as both clubs and as individual donors.

Programs

• We are still recovering from the impact Covid had on reducing the number of dogs we were able to breed and therefore match with clients. However, we are returning to a more normal schedule and hope to match 100 clients with dogs in 2023 – that is an impressive growth of 32 percent over last year.

40th Anniversary

• We are excited to celebrate our 40th year of operations. Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides first opened as a result of the vision and leadership of Lions back in 1983 under the name Canine Vision Canada. Over the past 40 years, we have grown and expanded to include seven distinct programs and provide support on an annual basis to over 1,000 clients across Canada.

As Lions, you should all be very proud of the role you have played in making LFCDG a reality to help transform the way so many individuals live their lives with confidence and independence.

ART OF RECOGNITION

The following are presentation notes taken by MD5 New Voices coordinator Lion Crystal (Fargo Gateway Lions) at the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Calgary in September 2022. The speaker was PDG Lion Wanda Eddy, who was participating in her first Forum and was making her first presentation.

At the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in 2022, PDG Lion Wanda Eddy discussed the importance of giving thanks and showing appreciation to the Lions in our clubs and our districts who rise above the usual volunteering for projects.

Lion Wanda emphasized that recognition reinforces their efforts and shared some simple ways to show how they are appreciated:

- 1. Thank them in front of their peers at the club meeting.
- 2. Offer tickets to a local sports game to the head of a committee, or a fishing rod to the head of the fishing derby.
- 3. Invite them to have a cup of coffee with you.

- 4. Let them know they did a good job. They could be asked if they are ready for another opportunity to serve and if they would help with another project.
- 5. Ask all the people who helped clean the park or the ditches to stand up at the club meeting to be applauded with thanks.
- 6. District Governors could give them appreciation in their monthly newsletters.
- 7. They could be given a Lion of the Year plaque from the club.
- 8. They could receive a certificate of excellence at the club's endof-year party from the club president or as recognition during a DG visit in the current term.
- 9. A DG could give appreciation to a Lion attending the local convention or at a multiple-district convention. (Ask them to stand for recognition)
- 10. Mention all they have accomplished during a Melvin Jones Fellowship ceremony.
- 11. For 50-year or 60-year or more members consider the club hosting a dinner dedicated to honouring them for their many years of service.

or many years, Lions have been involved in the provision of services to meet a particular need – the scourge of diabetes around the world. What perhaps started as a prevention task – devoted towards preventing and eradication of the leading cause of blindness (diabetic retinopathy) – it has become a global cause in its own right!

Why? In Canada, it is estimated that one in three Canadians has diabetes or pre-diabetes! And \$15.3B will be spent on diabetes-related healthcare. 700 million cases are anticipated around the world, 50% of which are undiagnosed; and 10% of all health expenditure is due to diabetes. 374 million people are at an increased risk of type 2 diabetes, and type 1 diabetes has no known cause or cure!

So we have a need! Where there's a need, there's a Lion!

For many years Saskatchewan Lions participated in the annual Cavalcade for

Diabetes. A significant portion of funds collected was used to fund diabetes-education vans for use in Saskatchewan, particularly in northern

Saskatchewan. As well, other Clubs participated in camp programs and direct donations to Diabetes Canada (previously known as Canadian Diabetes Association).

But Covid-19 hit! Diabetes Canada was forced to withdraw several of its efforts due to a funding shortfall (including the support of the diabetes-van education projects). Diabetic Camps were reduced or cancelled. And diabetic screening efforts were often not encouraged.

We are in the process of rebuilding. Diabetes Canada is examining its priorities and support activities. And Lions have had to re-examine their efforts to support diabetic programs. Lions from across Canada are in discussions with Diabetes Canada.

to assist Lions with the selection of activities. The main goals are not in question – diabetes "education and screening", support of programs (such as "diabetic camps and peer support groups"), and contributions to "research" into the cause and prevention of diabetes. The avenues for Lions activities are numerous:

1. General support of diabetic activities through a donation labelled for "Diabetes" and made to the Saskatchewan

 General support of diabetic activities through a donation labelled for "Diabetes" and made to the Saskatchewan Lions Foundation which has offered to receive Club and personal donations and disperse them according to the wishes of donors and the Diabetes Committee (Contributions to Saskatchewan Lions Foundation are eligible for a Marvin Chambers Fellowship if requested);

Recently a Diabetes Committee was formed in Saskatchewan

- Direct donations to Diabetes Canada or to other groups soliciting support and offering services to diabetics or supporting research activities (Contributions to Diabetes Canada are eligible for a Harry A. Newman Award if requested);
- 3. Continued participation in diabetic-related activities such as a peer support program, or diabetic camps, or diabetic screening or;
- 4. Develop a diabetes-related program with support from LCIF through a Diabetes Grant, or a Matching Grant, or a District and Club Community Impact Grant.

The Saskatchewan Lions Hall of Fame invites applications for nominees for 2023. A general outline of the eligibility and criteria appears below. We invite all clubs to submit a nominee, please use this form for your submission. The deadline for postmarked applications is **June 30, 2023** and the presentation will take place during the 2023 Saskatchewan Lions Convention (on Friday evening, October 27, 2023) at the Travelodge in Saskatoon, SK.

There will be annual selections through a nomination process starting at the club level, which will recognize a Lion or PDG for their contributions to Lionism and their community. The names of recipients will be placed on a large plaque and they will receive a small keeper plaque and Hall of Fame pin (year engraved). Runners-up will have their nomination form kept on file for future years.

ELIGIBILITY

- 1. The nominee must have served as an active Lion for 10 years.
- 2. PDGs and Lions may be nominated by any active Lion. They must receive the endorsement of their club's Board of Directors and also the club members.
- 3. The nominee's activities and their contributions to Lionism must be fully documented by the club's Directors.
- 4. Former Lioness members who have joined a Lions Club may apply as a Lion/Lioness.

NUMBER OF AWARDS

Each of the two districts – 5SKS and 5SKN – will have three finalists in the Lion and PDG category. All living and deceased nominees will be combined in a single category. Deceased Lions and PDGs will be eligible when they are the only nomination from their district.

METHOD OF CHOOSING RECIPIENTS

A Hall of Fame Committee will use the total points awarded as the basis for naming finalists. Clubs will be notified if their nominee is successful and it will be up to the clubs to tell their inductee that they have been chosen. Names will be published in the *Lion's Pride*, so clubs are advised to tell their members as soon as possible. The sponsoring club or recipient is responsible for paying for their meal at the Hall of Fame Banquet.

FUNDING FOR THE HALL OF FAME

The Saskatchewan Lions Hall of Fame will be totally funded by the Saskatchewan Past District Governors' Association and the Provincial Convention.






