MD5 COUNCIL APPROVES UPCOMING CONSTITUTION CHANGES

The Multiple District 5 Council approved the following Constitution changes to come before the membership at the business meeting in May.

1. Change who will fill the MD5 Vice Council Chair position.

Current Constitution

Article VI Sec 2 – change who will fill the MD5 Vice Council Chair position.

Article VI

Section 2. OFFICERS

The officers of the Multiple District shall be:

B) The Vice Council Chairperson of the Council, who shall be the immediate Past District Governor of the District in the state or province hosting the next Multiple District Convention. The Vice Council Chairperson shall fill the position of state or provincial representative for their respective state or province.

Proposed change

Article VI. 2. B

- B) The Vice Council Chairperson shall be filled by the state or provincial representative of the state or province hosting the next Multiple District Convention.
- 2. Article VI. Sec 1 B Change the number of PDGs that can run for the State/Provincial Rep. positions.

Current Constitution

Article VI. 1. B

Three immediate Past District Governors and/or Past District Governors from the previous two years, which number cannot exceed one-half of the number of District Governors who shall have been elected by the voting delegates of their respective province or state at the Multiple District Convention meeting of the previous fiscal year. There shall be at least one (1) immediate Past District Governor or Past District Governor from the previous two years each from Saskatchewan, North Dakota, and South Dakota. The State or Provincial Representatives shall serve for a one-year term only and cannot serve in that capacity again.

Proposed Constitution Change

B) Three immediate Past District Governors and/or Past District Governors from the previous four years, which number cannot exceed one-half of the number of District Governors who shall have been elected by the voting delegates of their respective province or state at the Multiple District Convention meeting of the previous fiscal year. There shall be at least one (1) immediate Past District Governor or Past District Governor from the previous four years each from Saskatchewan, North Dakota, and South Dakota. The State or Provincial Representatives shall serve for a one-year term only and cannot serve in that capacity again.



While in camp, clients receive a pot luck fish fry and a fully-supplied pancake breakfast. There are fishing excursions twice a day; you don't require a fishing license as you are covered under a camp permit. However, if you wish to take fish home with you, a license is required. If

clients don't have fishing equipment, don't worry, we can provide some. If you wish more information

about the camp, contact Ken Schuster at 306-220-5985. If you have a business, we are selling advertising spots on the camp's pontoon boat for \$500 for five years.

MD5 NEW VOICES SPONSORS INT'L WOMEN'S DAY SYMPOSIUM

An International Women's Day symposium, sponsored by MD5 New Voices, was held on March 9th at the YWCA facility in Fargo, North Dakota. Emcee Crystal Dueker (MD5 coordinator), welcomed several Lions from Bismarck, Mandan, Carrington, New Rockford, and Grand Forks, as well as PCC Lion Marie Ann Ben and Lion Betty Cossett from South Dakota.

Second DG Karen DaSilva from Bismarck spoke about Gateway to Science – a kids' museum with interactive exhibits on electricity, robotics & other scientific topics - along with a portable display of an eye and optic nerve.

Fargo Gateway Lion Jihan Brifki/ Kurdistan spoke about arriving in the USA as a 7 year-old refugee from war torn Iraq. She is now an International translator. (She is in the front row along with her daughter, each wearing a gold-threaded gown from material from Kurdistan.)

Fargo Gateway Lion Nyamal Dei-Pajock/ South Sudan, spoke about being a member of a UN committee. She also presented a blueprint for building a medical/dental clinic to replace the current thatched open-air hut with a few cots currently used in her former village.

Fargo Gateway Lion Fowsia Adde/ Somalia, now a business owner, spoke about helping other immigrants find jobs and becoming self-sufficient.

Gateway Lion Vivian Johnson in her orange Liberian dress and turban, spoke about being from a war-torn area. She spoke from the heart about how becoming a Lion member has given her a purpose to serve others.

Fargo Lion Ann Sara Ben-Amie spoke about being from Haiti and how her uncle in Haiti, who is now legally-blind from glaucoma.



A group of smart, successful women gathered in Fargo on March 9th to celebrate International Women's Day, sponsored by MD5 New Voices.

She introduced Horace Lion Kristin Follman who is the director of the Haiti Eye Mission. The mission group includes Lion Dr. Lance Bergstrom, medical staff, and volunteers who perform cataract surgeries upon villagers of all ages. When blind young children have gained their sight then they are able to go to school. Sadly, social services for the blind or visually impaired does not exist in Haiti.

The symposium included a service project; creating 50 Dignity Kits. Volunteers became an assembly line – placing inside each reuseable bag a large bottle of shampoo, conditioner, body lotion, deodorant, a new hairbrush, toothpaste and toothbrushes donated by five different dental offices in Fargo, and eyeglass cleaning clothes donated by eye clinics. The kits remained at the YWCA for women in crisis.

AUTISM ASSISTANCE DOG BECOMES MOOSE JAW MAN'S NEWEST BEST FRIEND

Note from PCC Lion Gordon Ziegler: As our readers may well know, Sask Liquor & Gaming requires that proceeds from the Blue Jays Weekend Raffle conducted and supported by Lions Clubs here in Saskatchewan may not be forwarded to the Lions Foundation of Canada until a Saskatchewan applicant for a Dog Guide is accepted. Profits of over \$17,000 from last year's Raffle were recently released to LFC for just such a case. I recently received a thank you card from the teenage recipient thanking Lions in Saskatchewan. Below is the story from the boy's mother:

My name is Laurie, and my son, our family, and community, have been changed by the generosity of the Lions of Saskatchewan.

My son, Stephen, was in elementary school when he was diagnosed with Autism. He did well on the academic side of school, but the sensory input and changes in schedule were very difficult for him. A person bumping into him could cause him issues and he would have to remain home from school until he could fully calm down, which could take several days. Another reaction would be to run from school, and sometimes he would be home for a while – with me trying to calm him – before anyone noticed he had left. Living near a valley and a river as well as near busy roads, this was terrifying.

One day, we noticed how calm he would be when visiting my parent's neighbour. Stephen would go over upset, as we would have to travel and that would mean a schedule change, but once he spent some time with their HED Taylor, also a LFCDG, he would calm right away. Our social worker quickly worked with us to apply for an Autism Assistance Dog.

August 18, 2016, Stephen received his first service dog, an Autism Assistance Dog named Bingo. Our lives changed. Gone were most of the tantrums, the inability to adjust to schedule changes, and for the first time we got to stay – and dance! – at a friend's wedding. As for safety, the year before Bingo got into the school, Stephen ran away from school over 20 times. We stopped counting at 20. Since he's had Bingo, he has left

only three times, with leash in hand. As a youngster, Stephen was not able to attend school consistently. We planned for him to do half days if possible in high school, or take a few extra years to complete high school. We were ready to support him at home as an adult.

The part where you [Lions] come in is here; Bingo had been slowing down, and it came time for him to hang up his leash and retire in a life of luxury so we started the process of applying for a successor dog. We got a message in January that there was a dog ready for him!

At the end of February, Stephen and I headed to Oakville, Ontario, to be trained and to meet his newest best friend, AAD Doug. The boys had a strong connection from the moment they met. We spent 2 weeks in Oakville in training, and after a test to make sure

we were ready to go, we headed home. We had expected to take a week or two to get Doug transitioned into to school, but he was ready after one day of visiting the school! He is helping with sensory overstimulation and calming. He is quietly attending school and preparing to graduate with Stephen.

Your sponsorship of Autism Assistance Dog Doug helped cover the costs, and have made it possible for Stephen to continue on his life journey.

With the help of his AAD, Stephen will be graduating on time this June, in the top of his class. In the fall he is moving with AAD Doug to Saskatoon from Moose Jaw to attend USASK.

We are so grateful for the generosity of the Lions of Saskatchewan. Without a Dog Guide, Stephen's dreams would remain dreams. You all have made our dreams come true.

As some our readers know, Past International Director Marvin Chambers recently left Saskatchewan and moved to Medicine Hat, Alberta, an hour's drive from Richmound. He started the formal program for the evening by offering a history of Lionism and what Lions have accomplished in Richmound and world-wide since forming in 1917.

Lion Barry Manz, who served as the Club Charter President 40 years ago and who is also the current Club President, spoke from the heart as he described just a few Club highlights and history. About how we chartered with 66 members (current Club membership is 17); made Club visitations as far away as Great Falls, Montana; enjoyed ski trips and provided out-of-town catering; hosted Stampede Wrestling and rock concerts with the likes of Trooper, April Wine, the Stampeders and more. Lion Barry emphasized how the Club has poured so much back into the local community.

Recognition was then made based on Club donations to three Lions Foundations. The first was the Saskatchewan Lions Foundation Marvin Chambers Fellowships (one of which was Progressive) presented by PID Marvin Chambers himself. Two Lions Foundation of Canada Judge Brian Stevenson Silver Fellowships for help towards the LFC new facility were presented by 5SKS Vice District Governor Page Newton from Cabri, SK. One of these deserving local individuals has never been a Lion.

District Governor-elect Heather Vermeersch came 650 kms from Carlyle, SK and presented six Lions Clubs International Foundation Melvin Jones Fellowships, including one to a non-Lion former resident, plus three Progressive Fellowships. PID Marvin and his wife Lion Lynne then awarded Presidential Support Pins in recognition of International President Patti Hill to each Richmound Lion. Lion Marvin pointed out that IP Patti was Guest Presenter at the Club's 25th Anniversary in 2009 in her capacity as International Director. PID Marvin served as IP Patti's world Campaign Chairperson when she ran to become our fifth-ever Canadian International President and he now sits as her Presidential Appointee on the International Board of Directors. Also assisting in the presentations were PDGs Dennis Feduk (Carlyle) and Calvin Bachmeier (Leader).

Attendees found much to support in a Silent Auction, a grab bag table, and a Live Auction conducted by professional auctioneer Darren Lutz from Irvine, Alberta. He movingly described his appreciation of the efforts of a

pride of Richmound Lions when they spent a day cleaning up his flood-devastated farmyard. His exciting auction of a full-sized, framed Terry Redlin print with its familiar warm, nostalgic fall colors resulted in the painting being donated back twice. Proceeds from the second and third sales went to our local EMS/Ambulance Service.

And then the feature presenter: Alvin Law, who is now 63, lives in Calgary with his wife and son. This marked the third time he has presented in Richmound, and during this trip he also visited four schools in the area.

Most of our readers know his story: raised by loving foster parents in Yorkton, he was born without arms as the result of a drug called Thalidomide prescribed for his birth mother to combat morning sickness. Some in the audience remembered him from his Charity work years ago on TeleMiracle. And yes, he performed an astounding riff on a drum (see and hear on previous page).

Some highlights of his message:

- First impressions are not as important as last impressions; make yours as Lions a good one
- He thanked Lions for what we do and urged us to continue
- He told moving stories about meeting a nurse in his adulthood who had comforted him as an infant in the Yorkton hospital, and about the music teacher who believed in him and changed his life
- He called such people "Earthly Angels", relating his experiences to ours as Lions, and reminded us that we are Earthly Angels to the people we help and in whose lives we have such a positive impact

MC Lion Gordon Ziegler closed the memorable evening by thanking all who took part and with the request that, "We take care of each other."







Platinum Club Award winners will also be recognized in LION Magazine and at international convention.






BETTERING A NATION'S YOUTH AND FUTURE



Navigating childhood isn't easy. As they develop socially, emotionally, and intellectually – and face challenges at home, in school, and from peers – youngsters can become overwhelmed. Fortunately,

there's help. Fortunately, there's Lions Quest, the signature social and emotional learning (SEL) program from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), and Manitoba Lions building awareness of it.

"SEL programs help promote positive youth development and build skills for success in life," said Lions Quest Chairperson Gwen Argue, who, with a US\$15,000 Community Partnership grant from "Through Lions Quest, LCIF and Lions build healthier societies."

LCIF, led a multi-phase project to broadly share Lions Quest benefits with educators, students, and community members. "Children are our future. We must prepare them for success in school and to make their way in the world."

During one phase of the project, Lions Quest-certified trainers delivered an impactful Lions Quest workshop during a province-wide professional development day for K-12 educators. Representatives from local police services and Brandon University also attended. "LCIF expands our ability to help communities cultivate young people adept at managing emotions, achieving goals, and building important relationships," said Argue. "Through Lions Quest, LCIF and Lions are building healthier societies."
