# MAJOR LIONS EVENTS NEWS

#### INTERNATIONAL IMPACT OF NEW VOICES

ver 200 delegates from around the world gathered in a room at the LCICon in Boston in July to hear from *New Voices* Global Chair/PID Sanjeeta Jatja. She is the partner-in-service of 2<sup>nd</sup> International VP AP Singh. According to Lion Sanjeeta, in spite of drastic membership drops in June, there was still growth in one category – over 30,000 women joined Lions this past year. The May 2023 report showed that there are 455,243 women among the 1,365,000 global members.

Attendees also heard from Canadian Global chair PDG Nicole Lepage, who reminded the audience of the *New Voices* beginnings back in 2018 with President Gudrun Yngvadottir at the helm. It started with women, and now we see the impact of women's involvement many years later. For example, in South America, most women in Lions were limited to positions such as Club Secretary or Treasurer. The start of *New Voices* gave them support, and now many women are participating in leadership roles in their Lions Clubs and in their districts.

DG Lion Shyala Jayalath from Sri Lanka also spoke, describing how she was the first winner of 'New Voices for Membership'. Starting as a Leo, she then joined Lions, and is now the 2023-24 District Governor. She reminded the audience to look at the areas that can be championed, encouraged everyone to start speaking at conventions – get the talent on the floor.

DG Shyala asked incoming District Governors to be sure to make their four *New Voice* nominations within their district.

She mentioned that DGs could consider recognizing those who work behind the scenes, and also reminded attendees that this LCI Initiative can provide a platform for bringing in new ideas and that the *New Voices* nominees can be spokespeople.

DG Shyala noted, "It is not what I can do on my own; it's to inspire others to take up the challenge."

Lion Anna from Turkey was up next and she emphasized that Lions need to share

their success stories. One of her own was from a year ago. "In Kilimanjaro, our Lions built a school for the children in Kenya. We raised \$25,000 to finish the project. If you look at the LCI website, you can read about Lions in Tanzania rebuilding a school. The Lions of Africa joined us on the project."

Lion Jennifer Clarke stood up following Lion Anna and explained that she went to the *New Voices* seminar in Montreal, and is now the Club President. "Our motto is 'Where there is a need, there is a Lion'. In our community, there was a local family who lost their home. Our club raised money for their housing, food, and clothing. Because the public was part of this service project, my club gained eight new members. Service attracted them to Lions."

At the end of the seminar, Past International President Gudrun Yngvadottir joined her *New Voices* Team. She mentioned how pleased she was that the LCI program is still alive and showing such positive results. The program will be discussed again at the USA/Canada Forum in Reno – details to come at a later date.

#### LFC DIFFERENCE CAMPAIGN UPDATE - SEPTEMBER 28, 2023

Lions Clubs across Canada are gearing up in support the new LFC Dog Guide Facility in Oakville, Ontario.

The Difference

- Original expected cost of new facility = \$50M
- Total raised to date from all sources = \$39M (includes \$25M sale of old facility)

The proceeds go towards Saskatchewan citizens receiving LFC Dog Guides.







#### Member Portal Update

Latest information on the anticipated member portal update is that it will not occur until mid to late September. Testing & translation are occurring right now, but it will not be released until everything works correctly.

Lions can be members without an email address. After the update, distinct emails are required to use the member portal. You can still use the LCI website for any resources or information that you may need.

There are still a few clubs that need to have their 2023-2024 Club Officers. Any clubs that do not report a President, Secretary or Treasurer will not be able to access and report information on service and membership in the Member Portal. Contact the District Governor or the District Secretary if you want to report the missing officer or officers.

Report all your service in MYLION. If you are having issues reporting service, contact your District Administrator, your District Service Coordinator or District Governor. There are resources available to help you, but we need to know first if you are having issues.
