The first (of what we hope are many) “*Sharing The Love Valentines*” themed virtual 5SKS Social was a great success and lots of fun. Virtual games room and great social conversation in the main room kept everyone engaged and sharing laughter and stories. Many thanks to all who planned and participated in this event. We are now planning our

“*Hopping Into Spring*” virtual event – details to follow. Let us see if we can get more fun-loving Lions out to socialize with their friends.

We as Lions are committed to service – it is what we do. Part of this service commitment is to support those important initiatives that provide so many with the help and assistance they cannot live without. **Lions Foundation of Canada (LFC) Dog Guide Program** is one of those important programs that only survives and thrives through our continued support as Lions in Canada.

I was part of an update meeting with the Board of Directors of the LFC and staff members, along with a number of other Lions in Canada on February 21, 2021. It was an informative session. The LFC breeding program had been on hold due to the COVID-19 “lockdown” regulations in Ontario. However, it’s good to hear that it has now resumed, and two new litters of pups are expected to arrive in the spring. There are now approximately 300 dogs ready to come back from their “puppy parents” to the facility for continuation of their training and future graduation, then welcoming in as important members to their forever homes.

The recent “Give Tuesday” event brought in over \$125,000 in pledges, and individual donations from people – mostly Lions – has increased. A large portion of their annual funding will hopefully be from donations brought in by the annual “LFC / Pet Valu Walk for Dog Guides” which is scheduled for May 30. However, donations from Lions nation-wide are down from the previous year. I know Lions can do better in their support of our Canadian foundation – please help by donating \$500 toward a **Marvin Chambers award** that could be presented to a deserving member of your club or community.

COVID numbers are falling, and the vaccine rollout is just getting started. We look forward to a post-COVID time when hugs and handshakes are once again possible.

Since my last report, I have signed up for the Global Membership Approach webinar series and have had two District Governor Training sessions, as well as discussions about service projects, local membership initiatives, and our 2021 Saskatchewan Lions Convention in Yorkton. For fun, I took in Lions Trivia Night and weekly Burmester Virtual Cocktail Parties, and I also attended the New Voices Canada and Embracing Diversity virtual events. It’s been a busy time, and we are only getting started!

The International Lions Convention that was to be held in Montreal has been transitioned to an online event. The bad news about that is that we will not be able to travel to Montreal to attend. up activities as we plan for an in-person event in Yorkton on Halloween weekend. The 2021 Provincial Lions Committee and the Yorkton Lions have big plans for a fun-filled and informative weekend! In order to put on a first class event, we need Lions from all over Saskatchewan to support the Yorkton Lions Cub 50/50 draw, as some of the proceeds will defray Convention costs. There are vacancies in our Cabinet that need to be filled, and I would like to have representation from Clubs and members previously under-represented. A MESSAGE FROM YOUR 5SKS FIRST VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR ELECT ALVIN MATECHUK


Greeting Lions,

LIONS FOUNDATION OF CANADA SASKATCHEWAN RAFFLE



EARLY BIRD DRAW WINNERS

The Early Bird Draw for this year's LFC Sask Raffle took place on Valentine's Day, which provided a problem for Raffle Coordinator Lion Gordon Ziegler: how to properly 'stir the pot' of some 3,590 tickets to ensure equal opportunity. He solved this dilemma by dumping all of the tickets into his shower/tub – which had been fully dried, of course. The photos above show

the 'dump' and what the over 3,000 tickets looked like once they were in the tub.

The winning ticket drawn from the tub was worth \$300 and belonged to Maryfield Lion Derrick Hartlin. Lion Derrick, a member of his Club's 2008 Lions Provincial Championship Curling team, had purchased four of his Club's 100 tickets this year. Congratulations, Lion Derrick; your winning ticket will also

be in the mix for the Final Draw on April 16. Thanks to all Clubs and individuals who participated.

(By the way, some of you are sending extra money and names because of a shortage of tickets. That works great and I'm happy to fill out tickets on your behalf... but, of course, if one of those tickets is a winner, I would expect a modest commission. *Just kidding.*)

SUPPORT APPRECIATED AS RAFFLE SALES DOWN

Sadly, raffle sales are down significantly over 2020 – blame the pandemic! Compare these numbers as follows:

- LFC Sask Raffle Ticket sales Valentine's Day 2020: \$12,814
- LFC Sask Raffle Ticket sales Valentine's Day 2021: \$7,180

During these complicated financial times, your Lions Foundation of Canada appreciates more than ever any support you can give. A total of 51 Lions Clubs and 5 Lioness Clubs (17 books) have turned in tickets and money for this Raffle as of February 19.

LOOKING FOR IDEAS?

On another note, is your club looking for ideas? Try something similar to this one: Mantario, Saskatchewan, located 70 kms SW of Kindersley near the Alberta border on Highway 44, was a village prior to 2007 and its official population in 2011 was five. That's 5. Not 50, not 500 – just 5! But the heart of its Lions Club still beats

strong; the Club, sponsored by the Eatonia Lions Club and chartered in 1959, celebrated with a well-attended 40th Anniversary in their Community Hall, which the Club maintains at a nearby park. Featured guests included the recipient and family of an autistic child and family with the LFC Dog Guide which the Club had sponsored. Hearing and seeing the positive impact of the dog in this family (strangers to several of us) made many in the audience proud of their contribution and impact.

Club members are determined to continue doing what we Lions all profess to do: *WE SERVE*. Here's what the 14-member Mantario Lions Club did in December, 2020. They sold/purchased 11 books of tickets for the LFC Sask Raffle (that's 275 tickets, or \$550) and donated a significant number of them as Christmas gifts. Local households each received 4 tickets in their name plus an information page listing recent Club activities and donations. Now that's SERVICE! Good on you, Mantario LC! May you thrive for at least another 40 years.

BANNER YEAR FOR SASKATCHEWAN LIONS FOUNDATION

In spite of COVID-19, the Saskatchewan Lions – through the Saskatchewan Lions Foundation – had a banner year, completing the Retinopathy of Prematurity Program at the Saskatchewan Children’s Hospital, and making a major commitment to S.T.A.R.S. Saskatchewan.

OPHTHALMOLOGICAL EQUIPMENT ACQUIRED

The Lions of Saskatchewan, the Saskatchewan Lions Foundation, and Lions Clubs International Foundation were instrumental in purchasing ophthalmological equipment for the screening of retinopathy of prematurity, a condition that can lead to poor vision or blindness in infants. The equipment cost is about \$138,000 and is being equally paid for by the Lions of Saskatchewan and a grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

An additional \$40,000 collected for the project from the Lions of Saskatchewan has been turned over to the Children’s Hospital for support services for the program, services that could

not be applied for in the LCIF Grant. The final portion of the funds were recently presented by Saskatchewan Lions Foundation Chair PDG Ron Belke and 5SKN DG Marvis Wilm, and the plaque signifying the donation by Lions Clubs International Foundation by LCIF Trustee Garnet Davis. This involvement in the provision of equipment for the new Children’s Hospital is representative of one of the priorities of the Foundation – that is, children’s health. The Foundation will continue to take donations directed toward the improvement of health services for children in Saskatchewan.

SASK LIONS CONTINUE TO SUPPORT S.T.A.R.S.

In addition to this milestone event, the Saskatchewan Lions Foundation recently presented a cheque for \$20,000 to S.T.A.R.S. This represented contributions directed to S.T.A.R.S. through the Foundation. At the same time, recognition was made of approximately \$32,000 donated directly to S.T.A.R.S. by Lions clubs. S.T.A.R.S. is a priority of the Foundation, and the Foundation will continue to take donations directed to S.T.A.R.S.

At the most recent SLF meeting, it was noted that several clubs had cumulatively contributed over \$5,000 to the Foundation and its projects, including: Bulyea, Esterhazy, Eston 95, Fillmore, Katepwa, Moose Jaw, Regina Beach, Saskatoon Centennial, Saskatoon Downtown, Saskatoon

Nutana, Shell Lake, and Unity. Thirty-five clubs have contributed over \$1,000: Balcarres, Broadview, Burstall, Cabri, Carlyle, Central Butte, Churchbridge Lioness Branch, Cupar, Dorintosh, Duck Lake, Ernfold, Estevan, Eston, Fort Qu’Appelle, Historic Battleford, Indian Head, Kipling, Lake Lenore, Leader River Hills, Maryfield, Meadow Lake, North Battleford, North Battleford Bonaventure, Preeceville, Prince Albert, Regina Lakeside, Richmond, Rosetown, Rosthern, Spiritwood, Strasbourg, St Louis, Tompkins, Turtleford, and Yorkton.

Two hundred and twelve Marvin Chambers Fellowships have been presented, and there are 154 which are yet to be named. A Marvin Chambers Fellowship nomination form can be found online [>>> HERE <<](#).



2021 marks the 100th anniversary of **Multiple District 5** as demonstrated by the choice of this year's theme: **100 Years of Unity Through Diversity**. In 1921 the Sioux Falls Downtown Lions, Fargo Lions, Bismarck Lions, Aberdeen Lions, and the Rapid City Downtown Lions became the first clubs to be chartered in Multiple District 5. These Lions clubs deserve special recognition along with clubs from Saskatchewan who will be celebrating their centennial as a constitutional area. Throughout all of MD5, we are asking clubs to award 100 **Melvin Jones Fellowships** during the 2020-2021 Lions year. These Lions will receive special recognition during the Convention.

Various "live" events will be on tap as deemed appropriate and necessary but participation by registered Lions or guests will be solely from your home or other remote locations of your choosing and viewed on the **Zoom** platform. Eligible voters will be able to cast their votes using an electronic system. Training sessions, award and memorial ceremonies will partially be pre-recorded along with live question and answer time.

Perhaps the single greatest benefit of a virtual convention lies in the lower cost of attendance. There will be some costs associated with planning and presenting the 2021 convention but we have set an affordable **registration fee of \$25 per person**. Registration will be conducted through an online system that will take into account the Canadian / United States monetary exchange rate.

We encourage **ALL LIONS** in Multiple District 5 to register !!

Details for every part of the **100 Years of Unity Through Diversity** MD5 Convention will be made clear as we proceed.

Do not for a minute think that we're forgetting to have FUN. Lions SERVE but we also know how to have FUN! Stay tuned!

The CQI program offers you **three suggested ideas** for implementing the Club Quality Initiative.

1. Single Working Session (two hours or less): Helps identify areas of improvement, establish priorities, and provide initial ideas to committees to further develop their club.
2. Meeting Series (30 minutes during a series of meetings): Assess and plan during a series of meetings.
3. Half Day Workshop (four hours or more): Break into working groups to discuss club assessments and potential solutions in more detail.

2021 Lions Clubs Int'l Convention is VIRTUAL

Dear Lion Leader,

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- **Everyone's invited** – Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.

- **Elections** – Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.

NEW RESOLUTION – FEES WAIVED

Dear Lion Leader,

The coronavirus pandemic is continuing to impact the work of Lions around the world. As you know, it has also created financial hardships for our Lions and the people for whom we care. To support the incredible men and women serving with us, the International Board of Directors unanimously passed another resolution to help our clubs.

An overview of the new resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

- **Charter and entrance fees waiver** – We have waived all charter and entrance fees from January 1 through June 30, 2021.
- **Flexible payments** – No clubs which are in good standing as of December 31st, 2020 will be suspended or cancelled through June 30th, 2021 for late payment of dues. Full payment is to be received before June 30th, 2021 to avoid suspension or cancellation.

- **Please note that clubs placed on financial suspension on December 31st, 2020 will remain on suspension until the full balance is paid. Those clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at Lions Clubs International to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 1st, 2021.**

These additional measures will help Lions facing financial hardships and give our clubs the support and encouragement they need during these challenging times. For more than a century, Lions have taken on the greatest challenges facing humanity, and together, we will overcome this.

The world needs Lions now more than ever, so thank you for your outstanding service and commitment to our communities and the world.

DIABETES OFFICES IN SASK

The Saskatoon office is closed and will not be reopened; the lease on the building had expired a year ago and it was extended a year. The plan has been to close this office. There was thoughts of having an office in the Clothesline building but that is no longer the plan. The Regina Office is closed and has been for the last year; they have over two years remaining in their lease. The plan at this point seems to be that the office will be reopened, but they do not have a date in mind. When the lease expires, its future will be determined. No staff are working from home and calls to the office aren't answered.

LIONS SUPPORT FOR DIABETES

It appears that the Lions role in supporting Diabetes Canada will have to change. At present, obviously Diabetes Canada is not working out in the community. No one would expect them to be placing themselves in the dangers that exist because of the pandemic. Their program has gone virtual and they are still attempting to reach the people of Saskatchewan. At this point, I am discussing the possibility of providing funding for these programs with the District Governors team from 5SKN and 5SKS. It will be on the agenda for upcoming cabinet meetings. I am hoping that the June cabinet meetings will provide for 'face-to-face' discussions.



LOGO CONTEST FOR 'LIONS OF CANADA'

Winning design announced

The Lions of Canada held a logo contest in late 2020. They have since decided on their logo design and have provided the Lion's Pride with their process, as shown below.

Step 1: Lions were invited to participate. More than 60 logo entries were sent in for the contest. Thank you to all who participated with submissions.

Step 2: The committee solicited Lions and non-Lions, young and not-so-young to judge the entries. We were fortunate to have 40 judges participate in rating the logo entries.

Step 3: The judges' ratings allowed us to submit our top-rated designs to a professional design consulting team. That consulting team screened the submissions for compliance with our LIONS LOGO guidelines. For example, LCI's logo was updated in 2008 and some entries used the pre-2008 out-dated unofficial logo which is no longer to be used.

In addition, the logos were reviewed for possible infringement upon any other existing Canadian logos (e.g., Air Canada, Maple Leafs, etc.)

Step 4: Then, based upon both the design concepts rated highest by the judges, and trademark requirements, the professional team presented us with a compliant logo we can use across Canada whenever our Lions of Canada / Lions du Canada group posts online, or sends out print or email information.

Step 5: The Lions of Canada / Lions du Canada Marketing Group reviewed the proposed logo. Feedback and adjustments were recommended. The revised logo was then approved in both a colour version and a black and white version.

Step 6: Our design professionals created .png, .jpeg, and .pdf formats for the Lions of Canada / Lions du Canada Working Group to use for our National work.

- Each essay must be submitted with a completed entry form. Essays submitted without completed entry forms will be disqualified.
- Only one entry per student per year, and each entry must be the work of only one student.
- Essay entries cannot have already been published.
- Any essays found to be plagiarized will be disqualified, and the student will be prohibited from entering any future Lions competitions.


PROJECT CHEQUE ON DISPLAY IN ESTERHAZY

HOW to BID the 2025 USA/CANADA LIONS LEADERSHIP FORUM



Interested in Hosting a Future Forum????

The USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum reaches out to all parts of North America every year in an effort to identify cities that might be interested in showcasing their area by hosting a future Forum. A seminar is held during each Forum that explains the entire bidding procedure. A bid package is made available to all attending the seminar that includes a flash drive containing all the necessary information to complete a Forum bid. Unfortunately, with this year's Louisville Forum cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic, this opportunity did not take place.

However, an electronic version of the 2025 Bid Package can be obtained by contacting Forum Secretary Bud Wahl. The 2025 bid package is self-explanatory; however, if any questions arise or clarification is needed on any aspect of the bidding process, please contact Secretary Bud. **The completed 2025 bids are due by February 28, 2021.**

Future Forums awarded are: 2021 Des Moines—2022 Calgary—2023 Reno—2024 Louisville

Hosting a Forum requires the Host City to adequately meet the educational needs of the Forum and be a comfortable, affordable environment for the attendees, attracting an average attendance of approximately 2,000. The Single or Multiple District must work closely with the local Visitor's Bureau throughout the process. In fact, once the Lions of the area decide to submit a bid, the local Visitor's Bureau typically completes most of the work on the bid.

There are six main areas that require consideration: hotels, convention facilities, catering, transportation, audio/visual and local Lions volunteers. The Forum is planned and organized by the Forum Planning Committee. Additionally, there is a Host Committee made up of local Lions which plays a major role in the success of the Forum. Hosting a USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum is an exciting experience. The economic impact a Forum has on a city and the surrounding area is long-lasting. Pre- and Post- tours are typically made available so attendees can enjoy the local attractions the Host City has to offer.
